Missing School The Facts

<p>1</p> <p>Affects your learning</p> <p>Missing school makes you 12 times more likely to leave school without a GCSE.</p> 	<p>2</p> <p>Long term consequences</p> <p>If you miss school you are more likely to be out of work or even to be homeless at the age of 18.</p>
<p>3</p> <p>Choose a better future</p> <p>Persistently absent young people are more likely to be involved in crime.</p> 	<p>4</p> <p>Stay in school</p> <p>78% of boys and 53% of girls are more likely to commit offences if they skip school.</p> 
<p>5</p> <p>Can effect basic skills</p> <p>Some of the worst attenders are the weakest readers.</p> 	<p>6</p> <p>It all adds up</p> <p>2 school days missed each month equals one whole year of school missed.</p> 
<p>7</p> <p>Think long-term</p> <p>When you apply for a job, it is your schools duty to give you an honest reference about your attendance.</p> 	<p>8</p> <p>Keep up the good work!</p> <p>An employer is more likely to give you a job if you attended school regularly.</p>
